



Trails in the Mountain National Parks Not Requiring a Guided Business Licence

The following list of trails and areas primarily consists of short, hardened trails to front country attractions commonly used by the motor tour industry. Use of these trails do not require a Guided Business Licence as they were designed for high levels of use. These areas may be used by groups larger than those specified under the outdoor guiding categories. Park staff will recommend these areas to larger groups such as school groups to avoid congestion on single-file hiking trails. Any business accessing the trails listed below, with clients, is required to have a Basic Business Licence in the Mountain National Parks, however any trails not listed below require your company to obtain a Guided Business Licence.

Whether a company sends an employee with the group or drops them at the trailhead, they are in a position of trust and have a responsibility for the group's safety.

Parks Canada reserves the right to make adjustments to this list as needed in response to changing circumstances, environmental considerations and assessments, public safety and other operational requirements and considerations.
